

## What is Prenatal Care Coordination?

Prenatal Care Coordination is a Medicaid and BadgerCare Plus benefit that helps pregnant women get the support and services they need to have a healthy baby.

Prenatal Care Coordination services include:

- Transportation assistance
- Help getting the health care you need.
- Personal support
- Information on good eating habits and health practices.
- Information and help finding needed services in your community.
- Car seat information and assistance.
- Home safety teaching
- Stress Reduction
- Smoking cessation program/with incentives

If you are eligible, the care coordinator will help you get the services you need.

There is no copayment for this service.

## How do I know if this service is for me?

The care coordinator will help you by asking about your:

- Current and previous pregnancy
- Health history
- Relationships
- Worries

## Questions that a care coordinator can help you with:

- When should I go to the doctor?
- How will I get to the doctor?
- What are signs of labor?
- How does this work if I am in an HMO?
- What community services are available to me?
- What will my baby need?
- How do I use a car seat correctly?
