- In-person parties, and
- Large outdoor gatherings and other in-person activities.

- Hold online costume and pumpkin carving contests.
- Host online scary movie nights or costume parties.




Show Your Halloween Spirit:

- Leave Halloween treats or bags with goodies outside your door.
- Have hand sanitizer available.
- Place pumpkins 6 feet apart to help keep a safe distance.

Keep yourself, family, and neighbors safe during the holiday.

- Stay at home to celebrate—especially if you are sick.
- Wear a cloth face covering in public settings.
- Stay at least 6 feet away from people you don't live with.
- Wash your hands regularly for at least 20 seconds.
- If you are experiencing symptoms or have been exposed to COVID-19, get tested and quarantine while waiting for your results.
