Robin Elsner called meeting to order at 8:04 a.m.

2. Approve/amend agenda items.

5. Justice System information sharing.

Inmate Education Program information presented. (Attachment)

The next OWI Impact Panel scheduled for November 3rd from 6pm-7pm at the Law Enforcement Center.

6. AODA programming in Marinette County Jail.

AODA programming held on Fridays in the Marinette County Jail, 2 hours for males and 2 hours for females, up to 10 participants, 8 session programs.

7. Subjects suffering from mental illness update.

Two meetings held on how to service inmates suffering from mental illness and how to link services and treatment resources to solve issues. Decision made for no mental health court at this time. Jail personnel will transport inmate to Health & Human Services for services while in jail. The process is to identify issue and then Law Enforcement, Probation & Parole, and Judges work together to get inmate treatment services. Soon to be released inmates will also be identified when needing help and treatment.

8. OWI monitoring update.

6 inmates currently on Soberlink.

District Attorney Allen Brey commented that OWI monitoring is one of the better programs for safety of the public and is working very well.

9. Jail population update.

Jail population report presented. Sheriff Sauve commented of the many resources used daily for inmate bookings and releases.

Corrections Officer Grant Kuehnl inquired about DNA scheduling and sometimes the person has to wait until jail personnel available. Judge Morrison stated individuals are sent directly from court to make them responsible.

10. TAD/Drug Court update.

Currently 17 active participants in TAD/Drug Court and program continues to be going well. Monthly planning meetings are held on the second Friday of the month to discuss how to be more effective. Referrals “defined gateway” through three sources: District Attorney and law enforcement, Defense Attorney or Probation & Parole. Judge Morrison commented the successes overwhelm the failures.




