**5. Justice System information sharing.**

Inmate Education Program information presented. (Attachment)

Comments made that Grant Kuehnl did a great job organizing the OWI Victim Impact Panel and working with Child Support and WI Job Center helping inmates with job resumes, GED's and classes to improve themselves.

**6. Subjects suffering from mental illness.**

Discussion held on subjects suffering from mental illness, not just in the jail, but in the Criminal Justice System. Jail Administrator Majewski shared a newspaper article on the topic and would like to organize a work group to address the issue. Robin Elsner commented a grant for a one week crisis intervention training for law enforcement has been applied for thru NE WI Human Services Counties, approximately \$505,000.00, which will pay for training and overtime costs. Judge Morrison commented he has had a discussion with Brown County Judge regarding the impact of their mental health court program. Brad Schraven commented concerns of community resources to ensure care for mentally ill subjects that don't meet the current criteria.

**MOTION (Morrison/O'Hara)** to approve forming a work group to investigate solutions to address subjects suffering from mental health illness in the Criminal Justice System. Bob Majewski will coordinate meetings. Motion carried.

**7. OWI monitoring update.**

Four inmates currently on Soberlink.

**8. Jail population update.**

Jail population average for December 2015: 110 inmates.

2015 yearly jail population was 125 inmates.

2015 total inmate Booking count 1,947: 485 Females, 1462 Males.

**9. TAD/Drug Court update.**

Sara Plansky-Pecor stated TAD/Drug Court program going well. Currently 15 participants, 1 potential participant and 1 person has applied for exit phase. An evaluation of the program has been completed and we are awaiting the report.

Judge Morrison stated \$1,000.00 donation was received for the TAD/Drug Court program, commenting the money is great, but the support from the community is wonderful. He thanked the team that takes the program very seriously and why it is so successful. Morrison complimented Sarah Plansky-Pecor for her dedication and the need for clerical support.

Robin Elsner stated Anthony House has been very cooperative and is used for stabilization of subjects.

Sheriff Sauve commented due to the program, there are fewer inmates in the jail, which means less costs to the county.






