Bob Majewski called meeting to order at 8:05 a.m. Welcome John Lefebvre.

4. Public Comment.

Amy Johnson public comment regarding inmate classification and work release.

5. Justice System information sharing.

Grant Kuehnl has taken a new position in the county and no longer Inmate Education and Programs Corrections Officer. Bob Majewski recognized Grant for an outstanding job with the inmate education program. At this time about half the programs have been suspended until a replacement is found. Grant thanked everyone for the experience and knowledge with the position.

6. AODA programming in Marinette County Jail.

As of January 2017, the Jail has contracted the AODA program with Jessica Beauchamp, Off the Couch.

7. Subjects suffering from mental illness update.

Bob Majewski stated the issue with subjects suffering from mental illness is still being addressed. A meeting will be scheduled for a work group to discuss this issue. Sheriff Sauve commented it is labor intensive handling these subjects. Chief Mabry commented that law enforcement is caught in the middle, with multiple contacts with certain individuals, and generating many man-hours. Robin Elsner commented there is much behind the scenes work being done by DHS and he will continue working with his staff on this issue.

8. OWI monitoring update.

9 inmates currently on Soberlink.

District Attorney Brey left at 8:25a.m.

9. Jail population update.

Jail population report presented. The daily average inmate population in 2016 was 124.82, compared to 124.89 in 2015. Sheriff Sauve, Bob Majewski, Robin Elsner and Judge Morrison attended a meeting in Green Bay, WI on January 16th to discuss juvenile detention. Marinette County is currently sending juveniles to Sheboygan County. Options with surrounding counties were discussed.

10. New WI Drunk Driving Law.

Wisconsin is the only state that 1st OWI offense is not criminal. More discussion at a future meeting.

11. TAD/Drug Court update.

Sarah Plansky-Pecor stated there are 19 participants in TAD/Drug Court; 10 females and 9 males.

Marinette County Jail Populations




