Bob Majewski called meeting to order at 8:05 a.m.

**5. Justice System information sharing.**

The new Inmate Education and Programs Officer, Joseph Moser, presented the Program information (attached)

Sheriff Sauve commented that Joe Moser is doing a great job and that individuals should try and attend the Marinette County OWI Victim Impact Panel scheduled for Thursday, May 4th. Sheriff Sauve stated that he would like to see the inmate community service and roadside pick-up programs continue once staff shortages are resolved. These are very good programs. Bob Majewski commented that he and Rob Valentine attended the Civility Speaks session on the topic of the Mentally Ill in America.

**6. Subjects suffering from mental illness in the criminal justice system update.**

Decision made that Jail Administrator Majewski will schedule a reoccurring meeting with Health and Human Services, Law Enforcement, Probation & Parole and the Judges to address individuals in jail or those soon to be released that may need treatment or monitoring. Need to move forward with identifying and treating individuals. Judge Morrison will work on probation reviews. Comments also made about implementing a Mental Health Court if funding could be obtained.

**7. OWI monitoring update.**

8 inmates currently on Soberlink. There have been no issues and the program is working well.

**8. Jail population update.**

Jail population report presented. Jail Administrator Majewski noted that March had the highest population the jail has seen.

Sheriff Sauve commented that he had given Tricia Grebin, the new District 3 County Board Supervisor a tour of the LEC.

**9. New WI Drunk Driving Law.**

District Attorney Allen Brey commented on how the new OWI laws make a 4th offense a felony. Also discussed was how the new laws no longer allow for bail prior to sentencing or the Judge's discretion based on the facts of each case as presented. The new laws have created an additional strain on the jails, courts, and families.

**10. TAD/Drug Court update.**

Sarah Plansky-Pecor stated there are 16 participants currently in TAD/Drug Court. The team will be attending the Wisconsin Association of Treatment Court Professionals (WATCP) on May 10th.
