

Report to Marinette County Extension Committee, April 11, 2017

March 1-31

Outreach and Networking

- Civility Speaks: Learning more about transgender youth – March 9

We continue to organize Civility Speaks discussions because we want to affect quality of conversation people are able to have with neighbors, co-workers, families, etc. We believe it's important to be heard, to listen, and to speak in such a way that is respectful and encourages conversation. We partnered with Amy Reddinger, UW Marinette professor and director of the LGBT Center, to host this discussion about transgender youth. Thirty-one participants explored the topic and practiced deliberative dialogue skills in small groups. One participant attended "to learn more about LGBT communities and how I could be more open-minded toward LGBT people," and another asked, "What cultural issues can address these issues for our children and take away fear and stigmatism that may exist?" Twenty of twenty-four respondents said they would feel more comfortable talking about transgender issues with family and friends after attending this event. As participants learn about issues at our discussion nights, they'll learn how to transform conflict, take individual and collective action, and improve institutional decision making, which will lead to increased civic capacity and improved community problem solving. We're looking for other organizations with whom we can partner for future discussion topics, locations, and participation.

Pete and I discussed how we can engage with park visitors to learn how and why they use Marinette County parks. We know that forests, waterfalls, parks, and other natural resources are wonderful assets for the Marinette County. We see population changes in our county, and we know that Millennials use public land differently from previous generations. Brown County Parks conducted a focus group with young adults for ideas about future park system developments. <http://www.wiscontext.org/creating-21st-century-park-system-brown-county>. We'll develop a survey using Qualtrics (UWEX access) and work with park system LTEs to ask users to respond on tablets, provided by the county information systems office. LTEs would canvas the parks on a few busy days this summer. We'll collect data to learn who uses the parks, which parks are most heavily used and why, where people want more/less park maintenance, what activities visitors enjoy or would like to see changed, etc.

Biking in Vietnam came full circle to Marinette County when 60 people showed up to hear stories and see pictures from around the world. Attendees related their experiences by asking questions about biking, rural development, infrastructure, and economy. TRACC members attended and spoke with others about current efforts to improve conditions for biking and walking by partnering with local government, organizing educational programs, and encouraging people to join casual group bike rides.

**Monthly Report to Marinette Extension Education Committee
FoodWise Nutrition Education Program
John Pinkart, April 2017**

- Between month and early April, nutrition lessons were provided to low-income children and adults in Goodman, Pembine, Wausaukee, Crivitz, and Marinette. More than 450 total educational contacts were made and approximately 44 lessons were conducted. Sarah conducted the bulk of these lessons; John conducted programs for the Community Support Group.
- We are fast approaching the portion of our program year where the focus of our teaching is in the Marinette County Schools. Moving into May and June, Sarah will be shifting to doing more lessons with the WIC Program, food pantries, and Rainbow House.
- As part of the FoodWise Advisor duties, I traveled to Manitowoc on 2/22 and to Crandon on 2/28 to conduct 1st and 2nd Year Reviews for the Program Coordinators in those two multi-county projects. I then prepared written summaries of those meetings for the state FoodWise office.
- I completed additional work in March related to the Statewide Family Living Program Work Group of the nEXT Generation process.
- Planning for Fiscal Year 2018:
 - I have begun work on the annual program plan of work for the Marinette/Oconto Counties FoodWise Project. This involves renewing teaching agreements with area schools and agencies, planning multi-level efforts that extend beyond providing direct education, and developing the program budget. We expect to maintain our current level of staffing and program offerings for the upcoming year.
 - I met with Nancy and Sarah on March 28 to discuss plans for Fiscal Year 2018. It looks as if 2 schools where we have been working will not have high enough participation rates in free/reduced school meals for us to continue, so we strategized on other options for programming.
 - I met with one of the Marinette Elementary School Principals on March 30 to discuss programming options.
- I participated in a second FoodWise “Data Jam” in Madison on March 15. As I reported last month, the purpose of these meetings are to analyze information that was put into the UW-Extension Statewide Data Base for 2016 in order to better describe the impact of our efforts.

**FoodWise Nutrition Education Program
Fiscal Year – 2018
Marinette County Agreement Letter- Extension Office**

The UW-Extension FoodWise Nutrition Education Program has been offering nutrition education programming to the food stamp-eligible residents of Marinette County since 1993. During the period of October 2015 to September 2016—the most recent period for which we currently have data—8,021 educational contacts were made in Marinette County, reaching 1,161 persons at 6 county schools, Health and Human Services, the WIC Program, and other locations. We also work with community partners to make the healthy choice the easy choice where our participants live, learn, work, shop and play.

Much of the cost to provide FoodWise educational programming is paid with the approximately \$86,000 in federal funds that FoodWise is bringing into Marinette County during the current year. These federal dollars pay the salaries, fringe benefits, travel, professional development costs, and curriculum materials used by FoodWise colleagues in the county office.

FoodWise will rely upon Marinette County to provide office space and related overhead costs. In addition, Marinette County will incorporate basic FoodWise operating costs, including telephones, postage, printing, and office supplies into line items within the Extension Department budget. The maximum county expense of these line items will be \$2,500. These contributions are essential to FoodWise work and its presence in Marinette County.

Agreement Statement:

During the period from October 1, 2017 to September 30, 2018, Marinette County agrees to support Food Stamp Nutrition Education (also known as SNAP) as part of the UW-Extension FoodWise Nutrition Education Program within the County Extension Department by contributing the following:

- Physical Space: Offices, overhead and shared work spaces in the County Extension Office (used by FoodWise colleagues and other Cooperative Extension colleagues when they are working on FoodWise efforts.
- Resources such as supplies, equipment, information systems and county administrative costs (categories and amounts vary by county) to be used by FoodWise colleagues in support of FoodWise work. These resources are supplied to FoodWise colleagues as they are to other Cooperative Extension colleagues in the office. The maximum county expense of these line items for Fiscal Year 2018 will be \$2,500.
