Assistant Facilities and Parks Director Position

The proposal to move Parks from the Forestry Department to the Facilities Department in conjunction with the never ending always increasing responsibilities of the Facilities Department necessitates the need to add additional management staff. The Assistant Facilities Director position will first and foremost be responsible for the planning and operation of the County Parks System. In addition to assuming the responsibilities of the County Parks System the position will work closely with the Facilities Director to assist with carrying out the other Facility Department responsibilities and serving as a backup to the Facilities Director in the absence of the Facilities Director.

JOB ANALYSIS

This position is responsible to assist in the management of the department and overall condition of County facilities, ensuring safe and efficient work conditions. This position shall also coordinate operations, maintenance and development of Marinette County Parks & Recreation program. Decisions regarding daily work activity are made independently within the context of established policies and procedures.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- A. Serve as backup to the Facilities & Parks Director.
- B. Assist with hiring, conducting performance evaluations, assigning workloads and conducting disciplinary procedures.
- C. Assist with planning, communicating, implementing and monitoring the short and long-range goals and objectives of the department.
- D. Ensure applicable contracts, policies, procedures and regulations are satisfied and followed throughout the department.
- E. Maintain system of accounts, records and reports to effectively evaluate the operations of the Parks system.
- F. Assist with planning, scheduling and implementing construction projects within the department.
- G. Prepare, submit and administer grants.
- H. Assist with creation and administration of department budget.
- I. Assist with maintaining and upgrading County facilities.
- J. Identify malfunctioning equipment, fire and/or safety hazards and implement correction measures to ensure the safety of employees and the public.
- K. Assign and track keys and security devices for applicable Marinette County facilities.
- L. Provide resolution to employees and the public regarding inquiries and complaints.
- M. Assist in preparing requests for proposals/bids.
- N. Review the inventory and condition of department equipment, recommend new equipment, schedule repairs to equipment and consider rental equipment when necessary.
- O. Estimate time and material costs for various projects.
- P. Create a marketing plan promoting County parks, waterfalls and other facilities.
- Q. Create job plans and order materials for installations and repairs.

Create 2nd Sheriff Deputy Position Assigned to Recreation Patrol
and
Eliminate Two (2) Forest Patrol Officer Positions (Forestry/Parks Department)

The creation of a Sheriff Deputy Position assigned to Recreation Patrol in 2019 has resulted in positive outcomes however this position is only available to work four (4) days out of a week and every other weekend. The addition of a second Sheriff Deputy Position assigned to Recreation would allow for 7 day a week coverage. The Sheriff Deputies assigned to Recreation Patrol in addition to carrying out their recreation patrol responsibilities are also available to respond to other non-recreation related incidents on an as the need basis. The County has two (2) Forestry Patrol Officers who patrol the County Forest Lands on a part-time basis throughout the summer and fall. These positions have the authority to write citations for violations of the County Forestry and Parks Ordinance. The County Forestry Patrol Officers have little to no authority to stop vehicles and lack the adequate personal protection if confronting a potential violator if things were to ever go bad. Having a trained and equipped law enforcement officer enforcing the various rules and regulations is highly preferred.

ORDINANCE No. 417-19

**AMENDING THE GENERAL CODE OF ORDINANCES OF
MARINETTE COUNTY - COUNTY GOVERNMENT
CHAPTER 7 – TRAFFIC CODE**



Town of Peshtigo - Kowalski Walking Trails


