# What is an OHV?

- **Off Highway Vehicle**
- A vehicle designed for off-road use but can also be driven legally on the highway.
- Jeeps, SUV's & pick-up trucks.
- Does not include ATV's, UTV's or snowmobiles.
- Also referred to as ORV (**O**ff-**R**oad **V**ehicle).
- Street legal, registered & insured.
- No tractor tires, open headers & tube buggies.




# What defines a trail?

- Can be any length - quarter mile to miles.
- Include obstacles such as rocks, logs, off camber and elevation changes.
- Approximately 10'-30' wide.
- Include obstacles and challenges yet have by-passes for less capable vehicles.








# Who builds & maintains trails?

- Club volunteers!
- Titletown Jeepers have years of experience building and maintaining trails.
- Club carries liability insurance for work days.
- Trail builder Jeeps are identified by stickers.

**Trail Builder/Jeep ID sticker**




# Trail Identification

- Letter designation assigned to an area/system.
- GPS mapping with help of the county.
- Trail difficulty signs - moderate or difficult.







This Agreement is by and between Marinette County (County) and Dunbar Sportsman's Club (Club) and authorizes Club to enter upon and use the following described land (Premises) for the purpose of using and maintaining a metal building clubhouse (24' x 90'), a 24' x 60' shelter, a rifle range, three trap fields, five stand sporting clays course, and any other club related improvements either previously authorized or approved by the County Infrastructure Committee in the future.

Premises more particularly described:

That portion of the E1/2 of the SE1/4 of Section 25, T37N, R18E located east of the north-south runway, south of US Highway 8, west of the east line of section 25 to the existing ATV/UTV trail, southwest along the existing ATV/UTV trail to a point 175 feet south of the south line of the NE1/4 SE1/4, west to the edge of the north-south runway, approximately 40 acres. Attachment A, a map of the Premises is attached and incorporated by reference.

The term of this agreement shall be November 1, 2019 through December 31, 2024. This agreement may be terminated by either party for any or no reason with a minimum six (6) month written notice.

An annual use fee of five dollars (\$5.00) per year is due and payable to the Marinette County Treasurer commencing January 1, 2020 and due each January 1st throughout the term of this agreement.

Permittee agrees as follows:

- 1) Permittee shall be solely responsible to maintain the Premises in a safe condition at all times.
- 2) Permittee shall obtain approval from the Marinette County Infrastructure Committee for any filling, grading or excavating; the construction or placement of any structures on the property; or the installation of any utilities.
- 3) No cutting or trimming of trees shall be permitted unless approved by the Marinette County Infrastructure Committee.
- 4) All signs, postings, or other markers shall be approved by the Marinette County Infrastructure Committee prior to installation.
- 5) Dumping and/or storing of rubbish, debris, dirt, stone, or any other material on Premises and all other adjacent County land is prohibited without prior approval of the Marinette County Infrastructure Committee.
- 6) Permittee shall adopt and implement Best Management Practices for Managing Lead as identified in the EPA Publication "Best Management Practices for Lead Outdoor Shooting Ranges".

- 7) A Club officer shall be onsite to supervise activities whenever the ranges are in use.
- 8) Premises are open for use to all members of the general public under the rules adopted by Club.
- 9) County retains ingress/egress across Premises for access to adjacent County Land.
- 10) Club acknowledges ownership of the land by County and agrees no right or claim for possession or adverse use may be made against County at any time arising from the uses permitted by this agreement.
- 11) Other uses of Premises are not allowed and require separate approval of the Marinette County Infrastructure Committee.
- 12) Club shall restore the area to a condition as specified by County upon expiration or termination of this agreement. Such restoration shall be completed within one year of receipt of such specifications by Club, and may include but are not limited to:
  - a) Removal of all wood products debris and residues, fences, signs, and other improvements caused by operations of the Permittee.
  - b) Reestablishment of forest cover.
  - c) Any buildings not removed within the one year period shall become the property of County and Club may be charged for building removal or demolition.
- 13) Club agrees to protect, indemnify, and save harmless County, its agents and employees, from and against all claims, demands, suits, liability and expense, by reason of loss or damage to any property or bodily injury to any person whatsoever, that may arise from use or maintenance of Premises and Club shall defend County in any such action or claim.
- 14) All buildings on Premises shall meet town, county, and state zoning and permit requirements.
- 15) Club shall maintain general liability insurance in the amount of one (1) million dollars and provide certificates of insurance to County.





In accordance with DNR Forest Recon, there are approximately 6300 acres of timber to be set-up for harvest or thin. It should be noted that Recon updates and rescheduling will adjust this figure somewhat.

B. Timber Contract Inspections

Maintain a continual program of inspections on the nearly 110 contracts on file for the purpose of checking completion status, contract compliance and to reduce theft. The four foresters and scaler do the majority of this work.

C. Timber Scale

The Scaler is primarily responsible for maintaining the scale records for the approximately 80,000 cord equivalents of wood to be removed from the timber sale contracts.

### 10. FIREWOOD PERMITS

- A. Issue approximately 775 firewood permits per year. Periodic inspection and enforcement of Ordinance will be required. This will now need to be done by the rec officers.

### 11. FISH MANAGEMENT

A. Beaver Mitigation

Beaver issues are becoming a larger problem again with flooding roads and timberland. The DNR and USDA are cooperating with Marinette County and will continue a maintenance control program on the KC and Harvey Creek watersheds, and possibly others as monies are available, which may include blasting of beaver dams, cleaning out plugged culverts and trapping of beaver. In addition, state regulations regarding trapping beaver and removing dams have been relaxed considerably in an effort to reduce problems, particularly on trout streams. DNR personnel will continue working on the tributaries to the Pike River.

B. Fish Stocking

As funding allows, the DNR will continue with the program of stocking trout on class II and III trout streams.

- C. DNR will monitor the 7 existing trout stream population stations for long-range population estimates.

### 12. WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT

(WHF) Wildlife Habitat Funds – 5 cents/acre for County Forest Land. 100% State Aid.

- A. Aspen regeneration by forestry crew (item 7B) (WHF)

- B. Chaining and seeding to enhance natural regeneration of jack pine on suitable sites. (WHF)

C. Opening Maintenance

Openings in Wildlife Habitat Units 32 through 39 will be inspected and treated as needed.

A detailed proposal will be developed during the winter months. (WHF)

D. Opening Creation

Will be looking for opportunity to create two new openings for 2020 pending completion of openings survey. (WHF)

- E. Trail mowing and walking trail maintenance by Marinette County Forestry and/or DNR crews will occur as part of planned Access Management Plan, and at an approximate interval of one to three years. (WHF)

- F. Marinette County Forestry Department and DNR Wildlife Management personnel will continue to survey existing roads and trails on the County Forest. Roads will be identified and recommendations made on how they should be managed. A small percentage of the total road inventory is to be bermed or blocked by gates to limit vehicular access. (WHF)

- G. Gate construction for trail closure.(WHF)

- H. Wildlife Biologist and Technician working with Foresters to incorporate wildlife practices into timber sales and to plan new habitat projects annually.

### 13. COUNTY FORESTRY CREW BEAVER CONTROL

- A. The Forestry Department will be responsible for beaver problems on county forest land

related to timber sales, productive timber stands and protection of county forest roads. The forestry crew constructs gates for culverts where beaver activity has caused problems. The gates are periodically checked and cleaned or replaced as necessary.

### 14. FORESTRY CREW WINTER INDOOR/OUTDOOR WORK SCHEDULE

- A. County Forest and forest road sign repair and maintenance.
- B. Roadside brushing, to include snowplowing, brushing and pruning along County Forest Roads.
- C. Construct beaver control devices and logging trail closure gates.
- D. Maintenance of all forestry construction, site prep and planting equipment.
- E. Salvage and acquire timber and process into lumber and posts for forestry and parks use.
- F. Saw, plane and size lumber, as needed for forestry, parks, and other county departments projects.
- G. Timber Sale Area Betterment (SAB) (Item 7C WHF)
- H. Other projects, as necessary, such as building and road maintenance, welding and carpentry work. This includes construction of Parks informational boards and other Parks construction as needed.

### 15. FORESTRY AND PARKS DEPARTMENTS

Major construction projects for Parks will be undertaken using Forestry Department and/or Highway Department equipment and personnel where possible as time allows.

## PROBABLE DELAY CTH G RECONSTRUCTION

[Peshtigo, WI] –2019 is the wettest year on record for the area, the excessive amount of water has caused problems that contractors and homeowners haven't had to deal with in decades. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation and the Marinette County Highway Department have been working with the project contractor, Northeast Asphalt, to get all contracted construction work completed on County Highway G during the 2019 construction season. As recently as October 25th, there was a plan in place to meet this goal; however, due to weather and an unforeseen event at the asphalt plant, work was delayed.

The long range weather forecasts don't look favorable for finishing the paving and the remaining work this construction season. Due to this, we are likely looking at completing the County Highway G project in 2020, pending a good week of warmer weather yet in 2019.

Northeast Asphalt will be working to complete a paved driving surface on County Highway G and creating transitions to connecting roads and driveways for winter snow removal. Temporary pavement markings will be applied until construction is completed.

RE: Winter Operations Policy

In order to minimize overtime costs the Marinette County Highway Department performs snow plowing operations during normal work hours (7 a.m. to 3 p.m.). However, there are times when limiting plowing between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3 p.m. Monday through Friday is not reasonable without compromising public safety. When inclement weather dictates the necessity to work outside normal business hours the Highway Department will use the following guidelines:

As a general rule, the Highway Department will make every attempt to keep the county and state highways passable during the time when a majority of the public will be at or traveling to/from work/school (7 a.m. to 6 p.m.), Monday through Friday. If through the night there is ice accumulation, substantial snowfall or if wind causes substantial drifting of snow, plowing operations will begin usually around 4:00 a.m. so that at least one round of plowing can be completed by 7 a.m. At the end of the normal Highway Department work day, if snowfall is minimal or has quit completely and drifting is minimal, snow plowing operations will cease until the beginning of the following day after the trucks have completed their final road passes.

If however, there is significant snowfall or significant drifting the Highway Department will continue plowing operations until approximately 8 p.m. After 8 p.m. the Highway Department will begin an operational recovery period so that the plow operators are well rested to begin plowing again the next morning. This operational recovery period is for the safety of all. We suggest that traveling during inclement weather be kept to an absolute minimum especially after dark. On Saturday, Sunday, and Holidays snow plowing operations will take place between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. The Highway Department will continue to issue an incident action plan when there is significant inclement weather forecasted.

**(1) Snowmobile Routes are to be so designated. The following roads in the County of Marinette, Wisconsin, are hereby described as snowmobile routes:**

(a) County Highway A.

(1) ~~All of County Highway A and County Highway W within the Municipal boundaries of the Village of Crivitz.~~

County Highway A/W from the easternmost Escanaba & Lake Superior Railroad tracks to Sarah Street and County Highway W from F.J. Street to Left Foot Lake Road.(Ord #116 12/17/92, Ord #126 1/20/94)

...

**7.09 ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLES.**

...

**(2) Designation of ATV/UTV Highway Routes**

...

(b) The following roads in the County of Marinette, Wisconsin, are hereby designated as daylight ATV/UTV routes during the period commencing May 1 and ending December 1 unless designated otherwise:

...

(12) County Highway L beginning at Cliff Lane and ending at Peterson Road all in the Town of Beecher.

...

*Section Two:* This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage, publication and placement of appropriate signage.
