ROADS **REVENUE:** **82,134**

The Forestry Equipment Operators maintained approximately 235 miles of County Forest Roads located throughout the County Forest. This included grading, brushing, fixing blowouts, building up road beds in the exceptionally wet spring and summer, installing a new bridge, replacing cluverts and regravelling roads. The source material to accomplish these tasks was taken from varioius gravel pits located throughout the County Forest.

PLANTING AND SITE PREPARATION

Approximately 213,000 trees were planted on 231 acres in 2019. Of the trees planted, 89,000 were jack pine seedlings and 124,000 were red pine seedlings. All of the acres planted were new plantings.

WILDLIFE HABITAT MANAGEMENT

REVENUE:

10,770

A total of 590 work hours were spent by state employees in 2018 on wildlife related projects on county forest lands. Marinette county employees also spent considerable time on wildlife projects, however their time is not accounted for in this summary. A breakdown, of state funded time and projects is listed below.

TIMBER STAND IMPROVEMENT (TSI)

There was an herbicide application made on a total of 91 acres in 2019 to prepare for planting in 2020. Due to the size and location of these sites, the herbicide spraying was accomplished in house by using a boomless sprayer mounted on the back of the Forestry Loader.

GRAVEL HAULED / SCREENED

The Amberg crew hauled approximately 4,600 yards of gravel from pits found throughout county forest land. This equals approximately 420 loads that were hauled off of county forest land in 2019.

DISEASE, INSECT AND ANIMAL CONTROL

This includes beaver control where flooding of County Forest Roads occurs. Includes chemical costs for prevention of Annosum Root Rot in conifers and 100 foot buffer spray of county lands adjacement to any private spray areas.

FORESTRY BUILDING

Costs include all utilities, maintenance, and repairs to the buildings at the Amberg complex.

FIRE PROTECTION

Primarily involves discing 75 miles of firebreaks around plantations to reduce fire hazard.

REVENUE:

SALVAGE

Blown down and damaged trees, as well as trees removed for road construction, are salvaged and processed into lumber for use by the Parks and Forestry Departments.

PARKS / HIGHWAY

Where possible Forestry crews and equipment are utilized on Parks and Highway projects and winter road maintenance to save outlay costs.

ADMINISTRATION

Costs include administrative and secretarial salaries and fringes, office supplies data processing, telephone, postage, printing, advertising, copying costs, furniture, etc. Revenue is derived from a state grant for the forest administrator salary.

ORDINANCE ENFORCEMENT

The Forestry Department had two LTE Forest Patrol Officer positions. These officers worked primarily on weekends and holidays and enforced the Marinette County Parks and Forestry Codes.

TOWN'S SHARE OF TIMBER REVENUES

Ten percent (10%) of timber sales revenues are distributed to the Towns containing county forest lands based on their acreage.

HEAVY EQUIPMENT PURCHASES

123,765

Heavy equipment purchases for 2019 included a Cat Tractor and a Miller Equipment Trailer.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

Costs include administrative and secretarial salaries and fringes, and any other expenditures related to tax deed properties.

Mr. Lefebvre, the Niagara Senior Citizens LTD respectfully requests Marinette County mutually agree to terminate the lease effective May 31st, 2021. As you know at the meeting held August 26th, 2020 at the Niagara Senior Center, our Board of Directors and the Director of the Center met with members representing Marinette County, the City of Niagara, Town of Niagara and Marinette County Elderly Services to discuss the financial situation looming over the Senior Center. After some discussion and several suggestions, our board met in closed session to discuss the matter. A motion was made to disband the Niagara Senior Citizens LTD effective December 31, 2020 but with a stipulation that we use the back office until May 31, 2021 under our lease with the County. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved. The use of the office will enable Niagara Senior Citizens LTD to complete all financial obligations and finish our last tax quarter.

Please understand that as a result of COVID the Niagara Senior Center has been closed and unable to raise the necessary funds to meet anticipated expenses. The Niagara Senior Citizens LTD asks if the County can assist with paying expenses related to utilities and water/sewer/garbage upon depletion of the Niagara Senior Citizens LTD funds and assist with snowplowing the Senior Center parking lot when plowing the Niagara HHSD Clinic parking lot which is on the other side of the building.

The Niagara Senior Citizens LTD is willing to immediately make available to the County for County use the area subject to the lease with exception to the kitchen which is used by Marinette County Elderly Services for food preparation for the elderly and the Niagara Senior Citizens back office.



The County should not be setting a precedent that allows small private groups/clubs access to public property, and allowing that property to be blocked off from others who use such public lands. The County doesn't have the money/manpower/or time to adequately patrol such property. Who would ensure all those who camp on County property have the proper camping/ firewood gathering permits? Tourism impact will be negligible at best. There is a reason there aren't any of these trails on public property in other Wisconsin counties or Upper Michigan. They aren't wanted. I have talked to exactly one person in the Goodman area who has actually showed any support to this proposal. Ask all the members of the committee if this were in their backyard would they support it. I am a property owner in the Town of Goodman, I would suspect most if not all of the Jeepers Club members are not property owners in the Town of Goodman, much less Marinette County. One of the draws to the County property is the lack of trails,roads, people etc. The Jeepers Club wouldn't have to pay any trail pass fees. There are plenty of County roads, logging roads, and trails that are already being used in ways that they shouldn't be. How can you take public property and give it to a private club without any compensation even it is for only a year or two? You cannot gate the property, so there is no possible way to keep people off these trails from the time they are accessible in the spring until they are no longer accessible in winter. I urge you to please deny this request. Nobody around here wants this, and there is no way this improves the economic situation in this area.

This would be a problem for locals as far as hunting, berry picking, land owners out there and destroying the natural habitat. Let them stay in their own area. They can't cause no one else wants them destroying their area either.

I was born and raised in Goodman, Wisconsin. I currently live in Armstrong Creek, Wisconsin which is only 5 miles west of Goodman. I have hunted the shrine road area with my family for the past 28 years. My father and grandfather and great-grandfather have all hunted this area since the town of Goodman was founded in 1908. The forest lands of Marinette County have supported a diverse natural habitat for some of the most sought after wild game in all of Wisconsin. This region proposed for an off-road park would completely destroy any hunting and wild game habitat! In addition to wild game the forest floor supports some of the best wild blueberry, blackberry, and raspberry growing conditions. The off-road park would destroy this natural vegetation and food source for much of the wild game that draws hunters from all over the state. The wild berry season generally starts around July 15th and continues until mid-September, this is exactly the same timeline proposed by the off-road park. As a mother I have been bringing my three daughters into this region to pick berries for the past 13-years. For the past 3 years we have been able to pass on the tradition of hunting this region as well as my girls grow old enough to join us. I am deeply concerned about the impact on the natural resources of this area. The gas and oil pollution, soil erosion, destruction of vegetation, habitat destruction, and impact on wildlife are great concerns. If you have visited this area you know the soil in this area is very sandy. The potential for erosion is great which includes potential impact on surrounding creeks. I encourage the county to strongly consider the environmental impact this park would have on the proposed area as well as the surrounding area. As you may once a group enters one part of the forest they will want to continue their riding on other areas of the forest....more 'wild' and 'unrestricted' areas. As a Marinette County owner and taxpayer, I vehemently oppose this OHV Trail System. Frankly, I am shocked that this is even being considered. The plan runs counter to the very reason we have county owned forest land...for the benefit of all. I cannot fathom a good reason why Marinette County taxpayers should freely give hundreds of acres of prime forest land to a private club, a use that will forever change an pock one of the county's most wild areas ("the Macintire"). I have hunted and observed wildlife in the proposed area for over 50 years. It appalls me to think someone wants to tear it up and have such as negative impact on the tremendous array of wildlife I've observed regularly on this land. And why tear it up? For the benefit of a very minuscule population of non-tax paying persons at the expense of the vast, vast majority of the population who pay for the county forests. This very much feels like Marinette County is relinquishing it's soul to accommodate this. This is not the highest and best use of this property. There is no land economics argument to support it or justify the environmental impact it will have. This makes no sense at all and feels like someone is doing this as a personal favor at taxpayers' expense. Is this cronyism, perhaps? I am outraged and cannot more strongly register my displeasure with this plan. Please, please, please do not allow this to go forward. Do not throw Marinette County's most treasured asset under the bus like this. Please be better stewards of our forests for us today and for our children tomorrow. I have great hopes that my yet to be born grandchildren will be able to enjoy the plethora of wildlife I have in the Macintire. Please do not allow that to be marred now and for future generations.

If this club can't afford land, how will they afford to build and, more importantly, RESTORE the land to pre-use condition when the agreement expires? The proposed area the Macintire has a long history of producing some of the biggest bucks harvested in Marinette County. Many families in town have a history of hunting the Macintire. Hunting is tourism in our area. It seems like you have a percentage of people that come up here and feel entitled to a good time at the expense of the habitat, wildlife, and local people. They have no respect for the land because they have nothing invested in it. As a result of this attitude, thousands of acres of hunting land have been closed off to public use, affecting the local people and those who use the land respectfully. We also lost hunting land due to the County's change in practices, for example clear-cutting land and replanting it with norway and jackpine. This might be more productive for the logging aspect but it doesn't do wildlife habitat any good. Another concern is that you are offering free land and this will open it up for any other group to make similar requests. Our snowmobile trails go back to the 60's. Our ATV trails go back to the 80's. Over the course of the year thousands of people use our trail system. Only retired senior citizens have moved up here. It has had no effect on our schools and has brought no jobs into the area. It has been overwhelming this summer with the number of people on the trails and roads and the town can't keep up with the grading and maintenance. When do you say enough is enough? I also have concerns about this survey. We are a small community with many elderly people that may not be tech savvy and unaware of what's going on, much less able to voice their opinion on the matter. The tax paying members of Goodman should have the most input on this decision. We have to live with it. The opinions of taxpayers of Marinette County should be taken into consideration next. In closing, the economic draw for hunting in the shrine region draws much more investment into the area than a 2-month park season. Despite it's short duration the park would have lasting impact on wild game via habitat and vegetation destruction. Please choose to support the local economy through support of wild game and the income those silent sports bring to the area.

This is an amazing opportunity to keep tourist dollars in our own state. It will be an economic benefit to the local businesses (from gas & food purchases to hotels & other attractions)

I can understand and appreciate that all users of the county forest should have an equal opportunity to utilize the forest for recreation. The quiet areas of the county forest, which were once better suited for the hunting enthusiast have become noisy playgrounds for offroad warriors. Understandably, each has a right to utilize the forest. However, as someone who personally bow hunts in this area and knows of a group that has gun hunted this area for more years than I can count, I wonder whether this is the right location. It would make sense to me that a location closer to town, or the highway would seem more viable, as it would be less intrusive to other users of the county forest(most people do not hunt close to the highway), and closer to rescue services in the event that they are needed. This would still bring the tourist dollars to the area without potentially losing dollars from the individuals being displaced. I do not support the use of this roughly 880 acre section for this purpose.

Very few quiet areas remain in this area. The ATV/UTV trails have turned formerly quiet and fairly smooth woods trails into rocky, washboarded, and dusty trails. Continuing to turn blocks of quiet forest area into playgrounds for additional offroad vehicles takes away from the areas for county forest users who are looking to utilize the forest for solitude. 20 years ago this area was quiet and enjoyable. Now it hardly pays to venture out on a weekend day due to the volume of people. More reason for me to sell my Marinette County property and move elsewhere. Seems the county cares more about creating a playground for tourists than it does about its local residents.

SPECIAL RECREATION USE AGREEMENT

This agreement is by and between Marinette County (County) and Titledown Jeepers (Club) and authorizes Club to enter upon and use the following described land (Premises) owned by Marinette County for the purpose of developing, operating and maintaining an Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) trail system.

Premises more particularly described:

All of S12; NW1/4 S13 and E1/2 NE1/4 S14 T37N R17E Town of Goodman, Marinette County Wisconsin.

The term of this agreement shall be July 15, 2020 through December 31, 2024 with an option to renew for addition period. This agreement may be terminated by either party for any or no reason with a minimum six (6) month written notice.

Parties agree as follows:

1. Club trail use shall be limited July 15th to the Tuesday immediately following Labor Day.
2. Club shall cover all costs associated with the planning, creation, operation and maintenance of the trail system, including, but not limited to removal of trees or brush, placement of trail obstacles and signage, erosion mitigation, litter collection and removal and disposal of any grease, oils or fluids that may accumulate in the soil as a result of a leak or spill.
3. Club Trail Coordinators shall obtain approval from the County Forestry Administrator or designee for all proposed trails and trail improvements. Trail improvements shall be conducted in a manner and during a time period approved by the County Forestry Administrator. Trail system shall be laid out in a fashion that will allow for the trail system to be blocked off when not permitted for use by this agreement.
4. Only natural materials shall be used to create the trail obstacles. All work shall be completed with minimal impact to the environment.
5. Only vehicles with stock exhaust systems may utilize the trail system.
6. County shall designate access routes and parking areas for the trails. Access routes and parking areas may be outside of the areas designated in this agreement for trail development with approval of County. Improvements and maintenance of the parking area shall be the responsibility of the Club.
7. Club shall install at its expense an Open Pit and/or Sealed Vault Privies at the trail head and/or parking area upon receipt of a permit from the County Land Information Department. The exterior of the privy shall be wood sided and stained/painted a natural color to blend into the landscape. All cleaning and/or maintenance of the Privies shall be at the expense of the Club.
8. Changes to the Premises boundary shall require an amendment to this agreement.
9. Club shall notify County of any fundraising/charity events Club sponsors or is a

participant to be held on the Premises a minimum of fourteen (14) days in advance of the event.

10. Club acknowledges ownership of Premises by County and agrees no right or claim for possession or adverse use may be made against County at any time arising from the uses permitted by this agreement.
11. Meet onsite prior to opening the trail system for the season and within 30 days after closing the trails to discuss any issues that need to be addressed.
12. Other use of Premises shall not be permitted without prior approval of the County.
13. Club shall restore the area within six (6) months of expiration or termination of this agreement. Such restoration shall be completed by Club and shall include but *is not* limited to:
 - a) Removal of signage and the incorporation of all materials used to develop the trails into the natural landscape.
 - b) The seeding of all areas, with a native seed mix, susceptible to erosion or those areas which are not anticipated to naturally re-establish.
 - c) Placement of obstructions at the trail heads to prevent use of the closed trails.
14. Club agrees to protect, indemnify, and save harmless County, its agents and employees, from and against all claims, demands suits, liability and expense, by reason of loss or damage to any property or bodily injury to any person whatsoever, that may arise from use or maintenance of Premises and Club shall defend the County in any such action or claim.
15. Club shall maintain general liability insurance in the amount of one (1) million dollars and provide certificates of insurance to County.
16. County may close the trails for any reason the County deems appropriate upon providing the Club a seven (7) day advance notice.
17. County may terminate this agreement upon default of any terms or conditions of this agreement by Club in the event Club does not cure default within thirty (30) days of written notice by County.
