1. Call to order/roll call.

Robert Majewski called meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

2. Approve/amend agenda items.

MOTION (Wruk/Morrison) to approve the agenda and move Items #6 & #9 after Public Comment. Motion carried. No negative vote.

3. Approve/amend minutes of October 20, 2017.

MOTION (Morrison/Morrow) to approve the minutes as written. Motion carried. No negative vote.

4. Public Comment.

None at this time.

5. Jail inmates suffering from mental illness/work group update.

Bob Majewski commented he has been in contact with Jail medical provider, Advanced Correctional Healthcare, regarding additional mental health hours, will need to budget approximately \$20,000.00, to enhance treatment in jail for inmates suffering from mental illness. First phase is what to do with inmates while in jail, second phase what to do with inmates when released, and third phase medication options. Robin Elsner commented, in addition to Bob's proposal for the Mental Health Court, is to move part-time crisis position to full-time for the mental health case manager plus cost of doctor to provide telehealth psychiatric services, total HHSD proposed budget would be \$43,406.36. Proposal will be submitted to County Administrator and forwarded to appropriate committees and County Board for approval.

Judge Morrison stated there are only 5 mental health courts in the State of Wisconsin within the 72 jails. Judge also commented he has been in contact with Representative Nygren who is getting the drug company to provide free Vivitrol to Marinette County for Jail inmates and Mental Health Court participants that have an existing AODA problem. Representative Nygren is sponsoring a bill to propose treatment projects in jails that do not currently have a program and encourage counties to participate.

6. TAD/Drug Court update.

There are currently 19 participants in the TAD/Drug Court program. 2 participants graduated in December. Judge Morrison commented there has been a total of 5 babies born to participants free of drugs. Progress is being made with the positives out-weighting the negatives. There is a Drug Court alumni group who are helping current participants. Employers in the community were praised for employing participants and helping them lead a productive life.

9. Jail population update.

Jail population report presented. Sheriff Sauve commented that the high number of inmates beginning in 2017 eventually lowered thanks, in part, to the programming through Criminal Justice Coordinating Committee.




