## CJCC Meeting February 2011

### Jail Program Notes

- ❖ One Marinette High School student started school in the jail on Jan. 24 and one here on a probation hold started 2/8.
- ❖ Now that we have many new programs, we are actually in need of another room. There was money in the grant already allocated to the acoustic problem in the gym. So we'll be looking at using that as an alternate program room when there are revocation hearings or GED testing scheduled. We intend to purchase folding, rolling tables (with grant money) for use in there.
- ❖ Some of the feedback comments on the Love and Logic parenting class were: "I think everyone should have to take it", "This class has not only made me a better parent, but a better person as well", "This is probably one of the biggest learning experiences of my adult life, and I'm 45 years old".
- ❖ There were ten more GED tests taken since Jan. 20, with one more completion.
- ❖ After many delays, there will finally be a program round table offered for all the jails in the Northeast Region, hosted by our Jail Inspector, on March 1<sup>st</sup>. This will be for promoting networking on information sharing and ideas for quality programming.
- ❖ I took the jail population list from 2/9/11 and checked the bookings for all 110 inmates. Of these, 91 had issues with drugs or alcohol or both. That's 82% of the jail population. We could provide AODA counseling in the jail with grant money, but when that runs out, we would have to pursue other options. The grant runs through August 31, 2011. I estimate the cost for this to be about \$90 to \$100 per one hour for 10 to 12 inmates.
