## **Jail Program Notes**

### **Prepared for the March 8, 2012 CJCC meeting**

- ❖ Regarding the eight lap tops for inmate use, the county got a quote of \$329.84 each for Microsoft licenses. Working with Jennifer Thiele, we should be able to get the licenses for \$50 each, for a savings of \$2,238.72.
- ❖ Financial Literacy begins again March 13<sup>th</sup>. This is facilitated by M & I and Peshtigo National Banks.
- ❖ The three week Work Certified begins again March 12, with nine inmates tested and accepted.
- ❖ Love and Logic Parenting begins March 27<sup>th</sup>.
- ❖ There have been 19 GED tests taken by inmates since January 1<sup>st</sup>, with two completions, one with honors. We have six more inmates taking tests March 13<sup>th</sup>.
- ❖ We purchased a camera and have begun taking pictures of the graduates in cap and gown. We also have the correct cords for honors/high honors. We'll be using the Wal Mart gift cards to get the pictures developed, so the inmates can have one also. The caps, gowns, cords, etc. were donated by NWTC.
- ❖ NWTC continues to send their Academic Advisors over once a month to assist the inmates in applying for continuing education.
- ❖ No high school students at this time.
- ❖ The interim mental health counselor agreed to do the Cage Your Rage classes and they began February 2.
- ❖ We had a Peshtigo High School teacher, Dan Vanidistine, volunteer to help with programs as needed, and he started a Stinking Thinking class for males on February 8<sup>th</sup>. Jail Outreach began a class for women on February 9<sup>th</sup>.
- ❖ The gym padding has been installed and the room is much quieter. The folding table was delivered, so the gym can now be used as an alternate program room.
- ❖ I'd like to thank Officer Cathi Malke for all her assistance with the recidivism study.
