CJCC Meeting Jail Program Notes

Marinette County Sheriff's Office

- One high school student is incarcerated and receiving services from Marinette High School. He is on pace to attain his diploma this summer.
- Currently, seven inmates are enrolled in the GED program. Since our last meeting there have been three GED testing dates, May 22nd, May 26th and June 9th. During those dates, nine GED tests were administered, with five passes and one GED completion. The total number of passed GED tests in the jail this year is 29, with four completions.
- Five male inmates received certificates for completing the anger management program on May 27th. Currently, there are seven male inmates participating in the program.
- Four inmates who did not have a job when they were first incarcerated, completed the job center workshop and are now employed working Huber inmates.
- On 6/18/15, an instructor through the job center conducted a one day program for offenders with a criminal history. Eight inmates attended the program.
- Recently connected Treatment Drug Court Coordinator, Sara Plansky-Pecor with WIA Case Manger Deb Stacie. Deb has been able to provide assistance to two treatment drug court participants. One participant is receiving assistance to purchase tools and books for starting the CNC program at NWTC. While another participant is receiving assistance for cost of GED tests.
- A six session male cognitive thinking program began on June 9th with nine participants. A female program will begin on June 23rd.
- As of today, inmate workers taking part in painting the jail have approximately 584 man hours invested in painting.
- Badger Park inmate workers currently have 640 community service hours completed.
- As of today the community service road crew has been out trash picking seven times. Cleaning up ditches on County Highways T, W, B and BB.
- Set to have a victim impact panel meeting on June 30th to fine-tune details and form a committee.
