Jail Administrator Bob Majewski stated annual Jail inspection was recently completed. April 1<sup>st</sup> is effective date of law to take DNA samples on all felony arrests and certain misdemeanors.

Seven inmates currently on Soberlink with one inmate not fully cooperating.

**7. Jail population update.**

Jail population averages: 111 inmates. Huber program getting full.

**8. TAD/Drug Court update.**

Sara Plansky-Pecor reported there are currently five participants.

- One person in phase 2 and doing well.
- One person began process but didn't follow-thru with assessment.
- Two people employed full-time.
- Two doing community service regularly.

## Jail Program Notes

### CJCC Meeting

- Two high school students are currently incarcerated and enrolled at Marinette High School.
- On the past two testing dates there have been five more passed and one failed GED test. There will be two inmates ready to test again on 2/24/15. GED ready tests are on special this month for one dollar, normally they're six dollars. The jail recently purchased 10 GED vouchers to be used in place of credit card payment for GED tests. This will help make test registration with NWTC a much easier process.
- A second inmate was selected and approved for the "Marinette Jail Project." His job center case manager has established a post-release plan including continuing education and employment search. The inmate will meet with the case manager upon his release to start the plan.
- There has been a lot of positive feedback from the new female Self-esteem class. Inmates are saying it's the best class the jail offers.
- A male Stinking Thinking class began on 2/12/15, with 12 participants. The six week course is taught by volunteer Dan Vanidestine. A female class will be starting the beginning of March.
- Three female inmates completed Anger Management and received a certificate on 2/12/15. A male Anger Management class will start on 2/25/15.
- A six week male Financial Literacy class, put on by Stephenson National Bank, will also start on 2/25/15.
- Recently, started a female domestic violence "Book club" program. The program is instructed by Rainbow House Legal Advocate, Jennifer Randall. Inmates are assigned chapters from a domestic violence related book to read while in their cells. During the book club the instructor and inmates reflect on the assigned readings as a group.
- Currently in the process of gathering information to start a Victim impact program. I have talked with the director of Mothers Against Drunk Driving to find volunteer speakers. In the meantime, the director will be donating a victim impact dvd, which includes three stories told by the victim.
